



Responsible investing for foundations, institutions and individuals

Verantwortungsbewusstes Investieren: Stiftungen, Institutionen und Privatpersonen

A sustainable economy – is this possible? What is responsible investing?

The Liechtenstein Congress offers a global forum for new insights and best practices. The role of foundations and their responsible investment policy, accountability and legal discretion in sustainable action are in the spotlight. Foundations control large volumes of financial assets, beyond the realm of corporate decision-making, public policy and civic accounting frameworks. Herein lie great opportunities in the making of choices for the common good, while securing investments for foundation sponsors, contributors, investors and foundation boards.

Eine nachhaltige Wirtschaft - ist das denn möglich? Was sind «responsible Investments»?

Verantwortungsbewusstes Investieren benötigt konkrete Orientierungspunkte, um neue Methoden und Erkenntnisse zu nutzen. Der Liechtenstein Kongress schlägt seit 2008 die Brücke zwischen den neuesten Theorien und bester Praxis im rapide wachsenden nachhaltigen Investment- und Entwicklungsbereich unserer Wirtschaft. Im Mittelpunkt des diesjährigen nachhaltigen Finanztages steht die Rolle von Stiftungen und deren verantwortungsvolle Anlagepolitik, ihre Rechenschaftspflicht sowie der rechtliche Ermessensspielraum für ein nachhaltiges Handeln.

Today most foundations keep their mission and their investment strategy apart. But they increasingly face criticism that some investments create conflicts with their missions, for example when health organisations invest in tobacco companies or coal production. Yet a number of pioneering foundations have come to the understanding that investments in line with their mission are not only possible, but also profitable and a perfect tool to finance development activities supported by grants.

The congress explores encouraging examples and discusses barriers for a broader implemen tation of mission based investments. Overriding challenges are posed by a global shift in resource policies, taking account of a decline in energy risks, climate change and broad natural resource depletion. Rising gaps between the wealthy and a growing worldwide class of poor, malnutrition and infant mortality are but some of the many equity challenges addressed by an increasing number of esponsible foundations.

The sustainable finance day also features six detailed workshops. These are:

- sustainability frameworks for foundations
- the carbon and microfinance perspective
- mission based and impact investing
- sustainable investment strategies for foundations
- investment behaviour of foundations
- sustainable investments from a legal perspective

Stiftungen kontrollieren grosse Vermögenswerte, oft jenseits von Entscheidungsprozessen der öffentlichen Unternehmenswelt, der Politik und der breiten gesellschaftlichen Diskurse. Sie stellen eine grosse Chance dar im direkten Fördern guter Zwecke und philanthropischer Werte. Für eine nachhaltige Erfüllung ihrer Stiftungszwecke haben Förderer und Stiftungsräte ein grosses Interesse daran, dass ihre Anlagen Sicherheit und Rentabilität in Einklang bringen. Jedoch erweisen sich Stiftungszweck und gewählte Anlagestrategie bislang bei vielen Stiftungen als zu wenig aufeinander abgestimmt. Investitionstätigkeiten mancher Stiftungen stehen gar im direkten Konflikt mit der eigentlichen Mission und werden hierfür zunehmend stark kritisiert. Wenn Ziele im Gesundheitsbereich einhergehen mit Investitionen in Tabakfirmen oder Kohleförderung, dann ist, zum Beispiel, ein Konflikt gegeben.

Viele namhafte Stiftungen beschreiten heute neue Wege. Sie haben festgestellt, dass Investitionen im Einklang mit ihrer Mission nicht nur möglich, sondern auch rentabel sind und ein perfektes Werkzeug darstellen, um weiteres Kapital anzuwerben. Im Rahmen des Kongresses werden diese ermutigenden Beispiele vorgestellt und Barrieren sowie Lösungsansätze für eine breitere Umsetzung von missionsbasierten Investitionsstrategien diskutiert. Grosse, trendkonforme Chancen liegen in der globalen Energiewende zu erneuerbaren Ressourcen, gesteigerter Ressourcenproduktivität, der Reduzierung der Kluft zwischen Wohlstandsschicht und der wachsenden weltweiten Armut, Unterenährung und Kindersterblichkeit.

Damit sind nur einige der vielen Herausforderungen angesprochen, für die sich eine wachsende Zahl von Stiftungen verantwortlich sieht.



In 2008, Stefan Behnisch was named Honorary Fellow of the American Institute of Architects. He has also taught at several institutions as Visiting Professor, including the Yale School of Architecture; the University of Pennsylvania, the University of Virginia, and the École Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne (EPFL), in Switzerland.



Jon Cracknell

Jon Cracknell has worked with the family of the late Sir James Goldsmith since the 1990s. He is currently the director of the JMG Foundation, which funds environmental campaigns on a range of issues including GM crops and also tropical deforestation.

In 2003 Jon helped set up the Environmental Funders Network (EFN) in the UK (www.greenfunders. org). More than 130 foundations have been involved in the EFN.

Jon has co-authored five detailed reports (the Where The Green Grants Went series) analysing environmental grant-making patterns from UK foundations, and in June 2011 co-authored the most comprehensive study yet of environmental grants from foundations across Europe, Environmental Funding by European Foundations: a snapshot. He has also been involved in a number of research projects mapping the capacity of civil society organisations working on environmental issues, such as the Food Issues Census.

Lecturer in 1999, and was awarded the 'Spanish Nobel Prize', the Prince of Asturias Award, in 2002. His textbook Sociology has sold over a million copies. According to Google Scholar, Anthony Giddens is the most widely cited sociologist in the world. His many books include The Constitution of Society, Modernity and Self-Identity, Beyond Left and Right, The Third Way and Europe in the Global Age. His most recent major work is The Politics of Climate Change. His books have been translated into more than forty languages.



Stefan Gueldenberg

Chair in International Management and Dean of the Graduate School, University of Liechtenstein

Stefan Gueldenberg is Professor of International Management, member of the management team of the Institute for Entrepreneurship, and Dean of the Graduate School at the University of Liechtenstein. Visiting research fellowships and professorships led him among other activities to the John F. Kennedy School of Government, at Harvard University, Sloan School of Management, at MIT and Vienna University of Economics and Business Administration. Christoph has been working on CDM related issues since 1997 and has been a member of the UN CDM Executive Board Methodology Panel for several years. Before co-founding South Pole he was a consultant and carbon finance expert with McKinsey & Company. He holds a Ph.D. in environmental scien-

ces, having written his thesis on CDM sustainability assessment methodologies.

During the last twelve years, he advised successfully registered CDM projects with a forecasted total of more than 100 million t CO2e until 2012.

The World Economic Forum (WEF) selected Christoph as a Young Global Leader in 2009. The Schwab Foundation for Social Entrepreneurship has awarded Christoph Sutter as a Social Entrepreneur in 2011.

He is a co-founder (1984) of The Other Economic Summit and a past Member of the European Parliament (1987-9) where he served on the Political Affairs Committee. He is a patron of Friends of the Earth International and a member of the Global Commission to Fund the United Nations. He served on the UNESCO Commission on Human Duties and Responsibilities (1998-2000). He has also served on the Board of Greenpeace, Germany, and on the Council of Governance of Transparency Inter-

national. He lectures widely on environment, justice and peace issues. He is also a recognised philatelic expert with publications including ,The Early Postal History of Saudi Arabia (London, 2001).

Born in Uppsala, Sweden, he is the son of the author and journalist Gösta von Uexkull and grandson of the biologist Jakob von Uexkull. After schooling in Sweden and Germany he graduated with an M.A. [Honours] in Politics, Philosophy and Economics from Christ Church, Oxford. He holds both Swedish and German nationality.



Christa Velasquez

Christa Velasquez is Senior Fellow, with the Initiative for Responsible Investment (IRI) at the Hauser Center for Nonprofit Organizations at Harvard University. The IRI promotes the development of the theory and practice of responsible investment through research, dialogue, and action and is the home of the More for Mission Campaign and the Responsible Property Investing Center.

For the past nine years Christa was the Director of Social Investments at the Annie E. Casey Foundation, a private charitable organization whose principal mission is to help build better futures for disadvantaged children and families in the US. She was responsible for managing the foundation's \$125 million social investment fund. Her work encompassed all aspects of social investing, including program design, developing investment strategies, underwriting and structuring investments and portfolio management. The social investment portfolio

has financed the creation of approximately 5,000 jobs, the development of 2,700 units of affordable housing and 500,000 square feet of commercial space, 2,000 charter school desks and 300 child care slots. These investments have leveraged \$355 million of co-investment from other foundations, banks, corporations, pension funds and individuals. In addition to the investment portfolio, she helped develop the impact investing field and was a cofounder of the More for Mission Campaign and the PRI Makers Network.

Prior to joining the Foundation, Velasquez spent six years at the consulting firm Brody-Weiser-Burns, specializing in social investing, community development finance and business planning for social enterprises. She received a bachelor's degree in Latin American studies from the University of Chicago and an M.B.A. from the Yale School of Management.
